1898

In August of this year Miss Smith left Sapporo, to take her year's furlough in the U. S. The school was left during her absence in the care of Mr. and Mrs. G. P. Pierson.

Before leaving, Miss Smith handed over to Mrs. Pierson \$24.87 ( yen ) which had been collected toward helping to pay the Majima school-debt. The sum was made up of \$25 (yen) paid over to Dr. Majima, together with \$50 raised from renting the School buildings during the summer. This total sum of \$75 yen was paid to Dr. Majima Dec. 10<sup>th</sup>, 98. The school still owes:

12 Interest on the \$100 of which \$75 has now been paid.

Shortly before school began, which was Sept. 14<sup>th</sup>, a terrific flood devastated the Ishi Kari valley, injuring the homes of some of our pupils and preventing many form reaching Sapporo when school began, on account of broken-down communications. Doubtless many people owing to losses from the floods, were unable to place their daughters in the school as they otherwise might have done.

The floods were followed by a damp, unhealthy season bringing colds, fevers, and sore throats in its wake. About 25 of the boarders and several of the teachers were sick during this time. All this greatly affected the attendance.

Takahashi Shizue Abe Haru, who returned to continue her lessons in English & taught in school till Febr. 99. Sakai Chiyo, who has gone to Tokyo to study, after teaching in the school till July, 98. [The last two names are marked *Graduated only in Japanese.*]

Miss Kawai Mitsu [*sic*], a former graduate, after finishing her 2 years teaching in this school, was asked to be substitute on the Bryn Mawr Scholarship for the successful candidate who was prevented from going ; & accordingly sailed for the U. S. July 29, 1898 and is now studying at a preparatory school in Germantown, Pa.
