1894

This is a marked year in Japan and in mission schools. The long talked of "Treaty Revision" is successfully accomplished; soon after the Japan-China war has begun. Miss Rose comes to help in the school from February. The school is obliged to leave the government buildings which it has occupied, free, for seven and a half years. It receives gifts amounting to 700 Yen; borrowed 500 Yen at 8%, 800 Yen from the Mission, purchases some old buildings and nine hundred tsubo of land, assumes a new name "Hokusei" Jo Gakko or "North Star" Girls' School and enters the purchased buildings, having cut off the Kindergarten department. All these changes together with the war (Mr. Osh[ima] the Kocho has been replaced by Dr. Shinada) naturally would affect the school. A christian [sic] school supervised by foreigners.
