Additional items of interest: The past 6 years on the field were very strenuous ones because of the Chinese incident. It brought out extreme Nationalism. But for the most part our work went on quietly in the north. Just before the Outbreak we had a week's celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the school and many alumnae were back for the week. An Endowment was raised on the field.
